

Father Ken's Note for the Fifth Sunday of Lent

The question, "Lord, will those who are saved be few? has within it a hint of arrogance, as if the questioner were self-righteous and sure of his station among the elect. If the one who made the query spoke with pride and self-assurance, it is safe to say he had missed "the narrow door" by a country mile. Certainly, he had not been saved from his pride and self-centeredness. He probably hoped there wouldn't be too many to clutter the landscape of eternity.



The sharpness of Jesus' answer suggests his questioner was self-righteous and more than a little smug, and the words "many will seek to enter and will not be able" should have humbled the man who posed the question. Jesus was not easily deceived and he was forever puncturing the pretensions of the proud. Those who were sure of their own virtue and righteousness were whittled down to size in the presence of the Master.

The real saints of the earth always are more conscious of their short-comings than the sinners who think they are saints. More often than not the hypocrites are self-deceived. They really think they are better than they are, certainly among the few to be saved. But saved from what? Are they saved from their hostilities and from their superiority complexes? Are they saved from their prejudices and their hardness of heart? Are they saved from the rationalizations and their disposition to make the worse appear the better part?

Salvation is not simply a matter of believing the right things and saying the right words. It is a matter of being saved from the sins of disposition, from resentment, from pride. Jesus was a realist in suggesting many would miss the narrow door.

Our prayer for the Fifth Sunday of Lent:

Save us, O God, from the sins we are inclined to ignore in ourselves, from pride and arrogance, from hostility and prejudice, and teach us to walk humbly with you. Amen.


CATECHESIS CORNER - HOW DO I MAKE A GOOD CONFESSION?

We do things that offend God and place obstacles between God and us. The best way to deal with sin is to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Through this sacrament God forgives our sins and gives us the grace to help us not sin in the future. There are **five**

steps to making a great Reconciliation. Step one is an Examination of Conscience. This is a time to remember when we have hurt ourselves, others and God. Step two is confessing our sins to God through the priest and expressing our sorrow to God. Step three, the priest gives us a penance. This is a prayer or kind deed he asks us to do to show God that we are truly sorry. Step four, we pray the Act of Contrition, which is a short prayer in which we tell God we will try not to sin again. Step five, the priest grants absolution by extending his hands over our head and praying this beautiful prayer:

God the Father of mercies, through the death and resurrection of his Son, has reconciled the world to himself and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the Church may God give you pardon and peace, and I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen.

What consoling words to hear as we remember there is nothing we can do that will make God stop loving us. He wants us to come to Him for forgiveness, and He gave us this sacrament to do so.






